As I sit in silence and pray and search to see what the Lord is doing, I am reminded of what an incredible year we have had here on the hilltop. We have celebrated baptisms, new members joining and new ministries being formed. We have left our beloved hilltop and headed out into our community. OUR YOUNG ADULTS HAVE BEEN EXPLORING AND ATTEMPTING TO ANSWER THESE VERY QUESTIONS OF TRUTH, BELIEF, AND CREED. WHAT THEY ARE LEARNING IN THEIR YOUNG CHRISTIAN LIVES ARE FOUNDATIONAL. WE COULD ALL BENEFIT FROM THIS DEEP EXAMINATION OF OUR FAITH.

"THE LESSONS THEY ARE LEARNING IN CLASS ARE DRAWN FROM SCRIPTURE" SAYS NATHAN BARRIER, THEIR TEACHER. HE DETERMINED LAST YEAR THAT THE STUDENTS' UNDERSTANDING OF METHODIST LITURGY WAS VERY LITTLE. NATHAN BEGAN WITH THE WORDS: ADVENT, APOSTLE, ARCHANGEL, ATONEMENT, BELIEVE AND ON THROUGHOUT THE ALPHABET OF BIBLICAL WORDS IN HIS TEACHING OF THIS CLASS. NATHAN SAID THREE WORDS THAT KEPT COMING TO MIND WERE "TRUTH", "BELIEVE" AND "CREED", IN HIS QUEST TO TEACH THESE YOUNG PEOPLE, BUT TRULY HE STRUGGLED GETTING TO THE WORD "BELIEVE".

"THE APOSTLE'S CREED IS A TERRIFIC EXAMPLE OF THE WORD "BELIEVE" AND ONE NIGHT, IT CLEARLY AND SUDDENLY DAWNED ON ME TO HAVE MY STUDENTS WRITE THEIR OWN PERSONAL CREED IN THEIR OWN TEENAGE LANGUAGE." "I HAD AN OVERWHELMING SENSE THAT THIS IS WHAT I MUST DO." SAID NATHAN.

"THE STUDENT CREEDS I HAVE RECEIVED ARE REALLY GOOD. I HOPE OUR CONGREGATION CAN APPRECIATE HOW HARD AN ASSIGNMENT THIS IS FOR KIDS THIS YOUNG." "FOR SOME OF THEM, STANDING IN FRONT OF THE CHURCH AND SAYING ANYTHING IS MORE THAN THEY CAN BEAR," HE SAYS. "BUT I HAVE A PLAN FOR THAT TOO."





HE STILL SPEAKS

Until recently, I've never thought much about getting messages or even missing messages from God. That always seemed a little presumptuous. Not that I don't believe it happens; it is well established that God still speaks. It's just that He speaks to others. I've heard many times that "God told me to do this" or that "I have discerned what the Holy Spirit would have me do." I certainly do not doubt them; just figure they have a much closer relationship with the Almighty than me. Then everything changed.

Last year, my pastor nudged me to go back into the classroom after 20 years completely away from it. Retired from public education; he wanted me in a Sunday School classroom as an assistant (back-up). I very reluctantly agreed but argued that the age difference was an issue. A few months later I was asked to take over teaching that class of teenagers after a train wreck of teacher shuffling. I protested. I was 56 years older than the oldest kid in that class. These kids were the age of my grandchildren! I feared being so removed from the 21st century teen scene would be disastrous. It was not.

Rather than deciding on a curriculum to follow, I asked God to show me the way. My goal, as I saw it, was to teach them who we are as Christians and why we believe what we believe. Nearly all my lessons were designed between midnight and dawn at some point during the week prior. I had no firm idea of what to teach until then and I never knew when I would awaken and be unable to go back to sleep (because that triggered the planning).

In the beginning, I certainly did not believe anything special was happening; only that I was going to teach what came to me. It was only when I began teaching the famous creeds of the church that I felt like I was being led. And for that whole time before the creeds unit (about 6 months) I thought I had been the one leading.

Last night, I began preparing the February II, 2024 review of our unit on 'Creeds' when the strangest thing happened. In the midst of typing questions wrapping up the study (February 4 was the 'last' lesson), these words came to me: "the gift of the Father's unfailing grace." I knew I had heard this phrase before and kept repeating it in my mind, over and over, and kept trying to type review questions at the same time. I figured it was Scripture (sounded like Scripture) but I had no idea where in the Bible it came from.

But it kept repeating itself over and over: "the gift of the Father's unfailing grace." So, after a few minutes, I gave up typing on the review, went to an internet browser and Googled "the gift of the Father's unfailing grace." Boy, the result hit me like a ton of bricks.

Edwin Lewis (1881-1959) was a well-known and respected Methodist Theologian and Professor of Theology at Drew University in New Jersey who wrote 'A Modern Affirmation' in 1932. I recognized it immediately as a creed we sometimes used in my boyhood church in Daisetta, Tx. Our pastor at the time loved this particular creed. It has been well over 50 years since I've read it or heard it or even thought about it.





God may come upon the earth.

Amen.

I ask you this: What else can I believe but that God spoke to me?



Here it is:

"We believe in God the Father, infinite in wisdom, power and love, whose mercy is over all his works, and whose will is ever directed to his children's good.

We believe in Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of man, the gift of the Father's unfailing grace, the ground of our hope, and the promise of our deliverance from sin and death.

We believe in the Holy Spirit as the divine presence in our lives, whereby we are kept in perpetual remembrance of the truth of Christ, and find strength and help in time of need.

We believe that this faith should manifest itself in the service of love as set forth in the example of our blessed Lord, to the end that the kingdom of


